#### **Greetings!**

"Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I say: Rejoice!"
—Philippians 4:4

This single verse in Paul's letter to the Philippians is one of my favorites in all of scripture. He is writing from prison, experiencing deep adversity and yet he is steadfast in his message: followers of Jesus must rejoice. It is, after all, an imperative! We must rejoice in God as the vessel and object of our joy/gladness. This is not easy. Life is hard and joy can be fleeting. And yet, there is practical wisdom in turning toward God, allowing ourselves to be known. Paul is known for his focus on community and so when we place this call to rejoice in his context, we see that it is through mutual supportshowing up for one another-that we cultivate sustaining joy. On Sunday evenings, when our Catholic community gathers for Mass, we do our best to live into this call to rejoice-in God and in the gift of being together.
